In the 8 months to Feb 23 exports of avocados recorded **6,110** tonnes worth A\$33.75m and was **15 per cent** below the same period in 2021/22 (Table 1). The overall value increased by 8 per cent. Unit values were 26.7 per cent higher at AU\$5.52 per kg. The MAT (Moving Annual Total) was 10,531 tonnes, unchanged since the previous month's MAT indicating a stabilizing of trends, though will fall in March based on DAFF data for March.

Hong Kong was the lead market with 2,443 tonnes, down 13 per cent followed by Singapore (-10%) and Malaysia (-31%). These markets accounted for 95 per cent of the

There were 245 tonnes exported to Japan (+172%) from Western Australia, and small consignments to Indonesia and Pacific markets (Table 3).


Queensland was the largest export state for the period and 48 per cent higher to 3,137 tonnes. Western Australia was 51 per cent lower to 1,180 tonnes including the 245 tonnes sent to Japan.

On a month to month basis the February exports were virtually unchanged at 689 tonnes compared to 685 tonnes a year ago and FOB prices were 25 per cent higher at A\$6.19 per kg (Figure 1).

MARKET INSIGHTS

Hong Kong (Dec 22)

Hong Kong imported 9,870 tonnes of avocados in 6 months to Dec 22, which was 45 per cent less than the previous year. More than 60 per cent is reexported to China. Australia supplied 2,246 tonnes or 5 per cent less. Peru is the largest supplier though was down 41 per cent to 3,374 tonnes where most of this is reexported to China. Chile was 64 per cent lower to 1,262 tonnes.

Singapore (Feb 23)

Singapore imported 3,419 tonnes of avocados in **8 months to Feb 23**, 17.5 per cent less than a year ago. Australia supplied 2,334 tonnes or 15.6 per cent less than a year ago accounting for 68 per cent market share. New Zealand supplied 53 per cent less or 324 tonnes while Mexico supplied 43 per cent fewer avocados. Australia's recorded CIF prices were A\$7.30 in February rising sharply from A\$6.27 average for the period.

Malaysia (Jan 23)

Malaysia has imported 2,143 tonnes of avocados in **7 months to Jan 23**, which was 7.6 per cent less than last year.

Australia supplied 1,302 tonnes or 15.3 per cent less than last year and holds 61 per cent market share. Philippines and Mexico are ramping up supplies again from low bases. Australian CIF prices were recorded A\$6.91 average for the period and increased to \$7.24 in January. (No later updates)

Monthly Export / Import Update February 2023

Japan (Feb 23)

Japan imported 34,014 tonnes of avocados in **8 months to February 23** and is 26 per cent lower than last year. Australia supplied 293 tonnes. Mexico, the lead supplier, was 33 per cent lower while Peru decreased 1.7 per cent to 8,274 tonnes for the period. Australia's recorded average CIF price was A\$4.77 compared to average A\$3.82 from all sources. The price from Mexico has fallen

IMPORTS

The imports until February 2023, essentially the 2022/23 import season arrived mostly from New Zealand. Imports of avocados were **12,896** tonnes worth A\$54.7m or 2 per cent more than last year (Table 9). Unit values increased 33 per cent to A\$4.52 and has meant the overall value increased by 36 per cent for the period. The MAT (Moving Annual Total) was 12,953 tonnes easing 7.2 per cent in the month showing that import momentum was slowing.



868 tonnes were recorded imported from Chile. Chile recorded shipments of 844 tonnes to Australia departing since October destined to Sydney and Melbourne which have mostly arrived.

February imports recorded 390 tonnes, pulling up early compared to 1,393 tonnes for the same month last year (Figure 2), and considerably less than the 2,670 tonnes recorded in February 2021 when Australia had a supply shortage.
