MIDDLE EAST

By November of the 2023/24 year, exports of avocados recorded **9,491** tonnes worth A\$38.89m and was **108 per cent** above the same period last year (Table 1). The overall value increased by 62 per cent. Unit values were 22.2 per cent lower at AU\$4.10 per kg (FOB). The MAT (Moving Annual Total) was 15,610 tonnes, up 9.9 per cent since the previous month's MAT showing a very strong positive momentum.

Hong Kong remains the lead market with 3,775 tonnes, up 97 per cent followed by Singapore (+42%) and Malaysia (+157%). These markets accounted for 84 per cent of the exports to date.

There were 758 tonnes exported to Japan (+238%) from Western Australia, and 314 tonnes to Thailand since the new protocol. (Table 3). Trade to Middle East recorded 354 tonnes.


Western Australia was the largest export state for the period and 522 per cent higher to 3,570 tonnes. Queensland was 8 per cent lower to 2,304 tonnes for the 5 months to November (Table 2).

On a month to month basis the November exports were 165 per cent higher at 2,251 tonnes compared to 849 tonnes a year ago and FOB prices were 33 per cent lower at A\$4.21 per kg (Figure 1).

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MARKET INSIGHTS

Hong Kong (Nov 23)

Hong Kong imported 12,608 tonnes of avocados from July to November 2023, which was 51.8 per cent more than the previous year. More than 60 per cent is re-exported to China. Australia supplied 3,714 tonnes or 85 per cent more. Peru is the largest supplier and was up 138 per cent to 6031 tonnes where most of this is reexported to China. Chile was 143 per cent lower to 1,614 tonnes.

Singapore (Nov 23)

Singapore imported 2,694 tonnes of avocados from July to November 2023, 16 per cent more than last year. Australia supplied 2,307 tonnes or 31 per cent more than a year ago accounting for 86 per cent market share. Kenya was 26 per cent lower at 102 tonnes. China has entered the market with 47 tonnes. Other includes Peru, Vietnam, Philippines and more with under 50 tonnes each.

Malaysia (Oct 23)

Malaysia has imported 1,873 tonnes of avocados from July to October 2023, which was 48 per cent more than last year. Australia supplied 1,457tonnes or 86 per cent more than last year and holds 78 per cent market share. Kenya increased 37 per cent to 181 tonnes and 10 per cent market share. Australian CIF prices were recorded A\$4.49 average for the year and dropped to \$3.80 in October possibly under pressure from low offers from Kenya recording \$2.31 per kg.

Japan (Nov 23)

Japan imported 25,627 tonnes of avocados from July to November 23 which is 22.6 per cent higher than last year. Australia has supplied 497 tonnes. Mexico, the lead supplier over a year, was 27 per cent higher to 15,337 tonnes and recovering from a lower volume year in 2022. Peru increased 15 per cent to 9,516 tonnes to finish their season. Australia's recorded average CIF price was A\$4.43 compared to average A\$3.99 from all sources.

Thailand (Nov 23)

Thailand imported 827 tonnes of avocados from July to November 23 and is 0.3 per cent higher than last year. Australia has now supplied more than Peru with 225 tonnes from Western Australia recorded. New Zealand supplied 452 tonnes and Peru

has supplied 150 tonnes leading into a changeover period to NZ supply.

India (Oct 23)

India imported 1,618 tonnes of avocados from July to October 23 and is 70 per cent above the same period last year. Tanzania supplied 1,539 tonnes and now accounts for 95 per cent share. Netherlands (ex Peru) is 84 per cent lower. New Zealand has supplied 32 tonnes. Australia's first consignments were recorded in June and July, with the July consignments recorded here though anticipating more to flow from December.

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The imports for the 2023/24 import are tracking 81 per cent lower than last year. Imports of avocados were 1,427 tonnes worth A\$6.44m (Table 11). Unit values increased 2.9 per cent to A\$4.51 and has meant the overall value decreased by 80 per cent for the period. The MAT (Moving Annual Total) was 6,864 tonnes decreasing 28 per cent in the month.
