Six days to go until Australia's Avocado Industry leaders land in Mildura VIC

Over the last few months Avocados Australia has been systematically presenting regional events to our growers across the eight growing regions. About the "Avocado Industry Afternoon":

The Avocado Industry Afternoon is happening next Tuesday the 8th of October at the Mercure. The afternoon will include the 10th Annual General Meeting of AAL (providing members with an update on AAL activities); the Avocado Industry Annual Levy Payers' Meeting

(providing an overview of the avocado R&D program and the new marketing strategy), and an informative session featuring guest speakers Simon Newett (Principal Extension Horticulturalist at Queensland Department of Fisheries and Forestry (QDAFF)) and local agronomist Lisa Martin (Director and Senior Consultant of Ripe Horticulture). About the "Tristate Qualicado Workshop":

The Tristate Qualicado Workshop will take place on Thursday the 14th of November at Bonyaricall Vineyards, 55 O'Connor Lane Robinvale. All avocado growers and packers in the area are invited to attend. The program includes information on how to achieve maximum shelf life, understanding tree growth cycles and canopy management and of course an opportunity to learn more about the Qualicado program. Growers who attend the Tristate Qualicado Workshop will also have the opportunity to undertake a short self-assessment of their on-farm practices. The self-assessment is designed to be a useful aid to monitor practices and identify areas for improvement. Why Do a Reject Bin Analysis?

If you are about to start your season have you considered doing a reject bin analysis? It's a powerful tool for avocado growers and packers and performs two main roles. For the packhouse it provides important information on the performance of the graders. If fruit is being over-graded and packable fruit rejected, it signals that some staff retraining in packing specifications may be required. For growers, data from the reject bin analysis can show the levels of fruit rejections attributed to specific causes. Once these have been identified, action can be taken to better manage the issues for the next season. A short video showing you how to complete the analysis has been uploaded to the Australian Avocado Best Practice Resource (BPR). A template analysis form as well as instructions on how to complete the report are available within the BPR as well. To register for access now click here and follow the prompts. Industry Update

Avocados Australia recently met with Thai government officials

Recently John Tyas CEO of Avocados Australia and Daryl Boardman the South Qld director for Avocados Australia met with Thai officials to reinforce the importance of the Thailand market to Australia's avocado industry. John Tyas made a formal presentation that provided an overview of the commitment that the Australian industry makes to industry research and marketing and how it sees itself as a valuable supplier of avocados to Thailand.

"This was a unique opportunity to be able to make this presentation directly to the Thai government officials," said John Tyas.

John's presentation outlined a possible way forward for both countries in view of the recently changed Thai import guidelines. The presentation provided the opportunity to show that the Australian avocado industry values Thailand as an export market and that we have the ability to provide a quality product year round. John also stated that the Australian avocado industry is willing to provide resources for independent assessment of Australian research if required. It was also put forward that the Australian industry would be willing to also fund Thai official visits to inspect Australia's research facilities.

Further updates on this matter will be provided as things progress.

Queensland Production Horticulture Workforce Development Plan

Recently the Minister for Agriculture, Fisheries and Forestry John McVeigh toured Rugby Farms in the Lockyer Valley, and launched the Queensland Production Horticulture Workforce Development Plan. The Plan, developed by Growcom with funding support from the Queensland Government, looks to assist industry meet their current and future workforce development needs. Written in consultation with industry, the Plan looks to take a regional approach to skilling and training by appointing five new workforce development officers. APVMA Chemical Review - PER13158 Dimethoate Permit Update

In October 2011 the APVMA suspended the use of dimethoate on a number of food crops due to potential dietary risks. The suspension period has now been extended to 5 October 2014. Associated permits have also been extended to 5 October 2014.

The following permit has been extended by the Australian Pesticides and Veterinary Medicines Authority (APVMA):
