Marketing Update: Australian Avocados at the ADEA Conference

Attending health professional conferences is a key channel for communication and engagement for The Australian Avocado Health Education and Nutrition program. The Australian Diabetes Educators Association (ADEA) conference is one of three major health conferences that Australian Avocados attends through the year and was held in Adelaide from 26-28 August.

Diabetes Educators are an important audience for communicating the role of healthy fats in managing diabetes. Experience from last year's World Diabetes Congress found that Diabetes Educators do not receive enough nutrition education and are therefore very receptive to new information for their clients. This was confirmed with strong interest shown amongst delegates that visited the Australian Avocados trade stand and took away copies of the Avocado Healthy Fats fact sheets and Avocado Health Report.

Of the 1500 delegates who attended, over 200 email addresses were recorded for the eDM database and further enquires were received after the event for more avocado fact sheets. As a further extension to this activity key avocado messages will be included in the ADEA communications program via their publications and e-newsletters.

Japan: McDonald's launches Avocado McMuffin



McDonald's launched their latest creation, the avocado McMuffin, in Japan at the start of August. The burger is made up of two slices of toasted bread, a slice of ham and salad leaves,

topped off with chunks of avocado in a spicy sauce. Like all McMuffins, it is specially made for breakfast!

The Avocado McMuffin can be enjoyed in three different ways: with a slice of bacon and a beef steak instead of the ham, with wasabi, or with a prawn burger and spicy sauce and coriander, or with a vegetable burger (carrot, soybean, and tomato) or chicken instead of the meat.
