NZ-Australian Avocado Growers Conference - Aussie growers to share their insights

Ten representatives from the Australian avocado industry that attended the 5th New Zealand and Australian Avocado Growers Conference as part of a Study Tour will be sharing their learnings in a comprehensive article that will appear in the Spring edition of Talking Avocados magazine.

The Avocados Australia Study Tour group consisted of six growers from North Queensland, two growers from South Queensland, a grower from Central Queensland and a packing production manager from the Tri State growing region. Between them the participants focused on ensuring that they gathered a broad cross-section of information on their main topics of interest, these being: Canopy management, Irregular bearing, Pest control (Fruit Spotting Bug), Plant health & nutrition, Nutritional benefits of avocados & uses, Rootstock, Disease (Phytophthora), Fruit Quality (reducing bruising), and Pollination. You will be able to read more about their experiences and learnings in the article.

The study tour participants also attended field trips at a number of locations and will cover these details in their articles. An evaluation of the study tour found that participants felt that they gained excellent value from taking part and greatly improved their knowledge of the NZ Avocado industry as a result. Activating Avocado breakfasts in the workplace

As previously updated Australian Avocados marketing activity from September through to December is focused on breakfast as an opportunity to grow avocado usage. By targeting avocado Lovers and Enthusiasts, our most loyal consumers, we aim to increase awareness and usage of avocados as a great weekday breakfast alternative. This tactical advertising campaign will be integrated across magazines and digital online sites and strongly supported through social media content on Facebook, the Australian Avocados website and blogging articles.

An exciting boost to the social media content is taking the breakfast conversation directly into office workplaces with a breakfast sampling activity. This activity goes a step further than traditional sampling where brand advocates will host avocado breakfasts with their colleagues in their workplaces to encourage trial and promote discussion. 640 brand advocates have been screened and recruited online nationally to each receive an avocado breakfast pack to host a breakfast. Armed with avocados, serving suggestions and avocado facts these advocates are self confessed avocado Lovers who can prepare a fun and tasty breakfast and share the avocado message with their colleagues. In return each advocate is asked to contribute to the project community page online by sharing their experiences, reviewing their activity and uploading photos.

This activity is being conducted by a specialist research based activation agency that has

previously completed effective campaigns for other major well known grocery brands. Their research background will ensure effective recruitment and reporting back of how the breakfast message was shared across the social audience.
